GYMNAST OF THE YEAR

Two-time All-Met battled illness to power the Eagles to their first Virginia 5A state championship and then dominated the individual allaround competition the following day, claiming the title with a score of 39.025. The Level 10 gymnast also repeated as 5A North region all-around champion by placing first on vault (9.925) and uneven bars (9.7) and second on the floor exercise (9.75) and balance beam (9.65).

All-Met took the baton nine seconds behind the leader before blazing to win the Distance Medley Championship of America at the Penn Relays in a photo finish. His mile split of 4 minutes 0.73 seconds was the second fastest in meet history, and Hunter became the first high school boy to win the DMR along with the individual mile (2015) and 3,000 meters (2014) in the 122year history of the meet. The Oregon signee clocked the nation's fastest 1,500 (3:42.42), one mile (3:58.86) and 3,200 (8:43.18) along with a U.S. No. 3 time in the 800 (1:48.64). After breaking the all-time indoor mile record this winter (3:57.81), the twotime All-Met Cross-Country Athlete of the Year holds the all-time No. 2 1,500, No. 3 mile and No. 73,200.





Rohann Asfaw Richard Montgomery / Jr. Won the 1,600 (4:20.95) and 3,200 (9:24.05) at the Maryland 4A state championships to finish the season undefeated in both events.



Tristan Colaizzi Georgetown Day / Sr. Led the Grasshoppers to a DCSAA championship, helping the school to 36 of its 87 points in the 400, 800, 4x400 and 4x800. Won the high school boys' mile in 4:17.04 at Colonial Relays.



Benedict Draghi Washington-Lee / Jr Claimed Va. 6A state titles in the discus and shot put. Dominated both events all season, registering a Va. No. 1 discus throw (172 feet 5 inches) and shot put (63-6).
