St. John's / Sr. A versatile player who impacted all dimensions of the game, Lee led St. John's to consecutive WCAC championships for the first time in almost 40 years. The shortstop had a .388 batting average with two home runs and 22 RBI; on the mound, he went 7-0 with a 0.43 ERA. The Maryland signee, a repeat All-Met and two-time D.C. Gatorade player of the year, batted .411 for his career and helped the Cadets post a 72-18 record during his three years as a starter. **COACH OF THE YEAR** 



Fifth-year coach led Bulldogs to second consecutive Maryland 2A state championship, becoming the first 2A team to repeat in more than 20 years. Southern is 33-17 during that run with most games coming against Anne Arundel County's stiff 4A competition.
